PARKING RULES

- Automobiles and all other vehicles must be parked on space assigned by the Parking Department. All vehicles improperly parked will be towed away.
- Under no circumstances can automobiles be parked around buildings, in fire lanes, or in open areas throughout the central part of the grounds.
- Livestock trailer or truck parking in assigned areas. Camper parking in assigned areas with permit only. See Livestock Office.
- The Society will not be liable, under any circumstances, through negligence of itself, its agents, acts of third party, or otherwise, for injury to the person or property of the owner or occupant, for any property loss or damage.

GENERAL RULES

1. **All rules and regulations referred to herein are made a part of the conditions under which entries are accepted and permits granted for exhibits and concessions.**
2. The Management reserves the right to interpret, amend or add to its rules and regulations.
3. Persons violating general, special rules or engaging in personal misconduct shall be subject to such penalty as the management may impose including forfeiture of all privileges and premiums.
4. The management encourages the reporting of mistreatment or extortion by concessionaires and any discourtesy or irregularity of its employees. Violation of local, State or Federal laws should be reported promptly to the Police Department.
5. **No pets, except properly identified service animals and properly identified service animals-in-training will be allowed anywhere on the fairgrounds. All service animals must remain leashed. Dogs, whether leashed or not, are prohibited on the grounds.**

EXHIBITS AND EXHIBITORS

Read carefully all rules pertaining to each department.

1. Applications for entries of Livestock must be made on forms furnished by the Society in accordance with instructions and rules of the premium list.
2. Right is reserved to close entries before specified closing date. Entries cannot be changed after closing date. NO REFUNDS.
3. Entries must be made in the name of a bona fide owner. Violation of this rule shall work a forfeiture of premiums.
4. **All livestock must stay in the designated area.**
5. **The Management has the right to require any unhealthy animal to be removed from the Fair Grounds.**
6. All livestock entries (except steers) must be registered with their National Breed Association. Hereford cattle must

be in the American Polled Hereford Association Record and or The American Hereford Assoc. All animals must have clearly legible tattoo identification and such identity must conform to the tattoo recorded on the official registry certificates.

7. **All exhibits must be delivered and removed at time indicated by rules of each department.**
8. Exhibits must be displayed in the manner requested by Department Superintendents.
9. **All livestock must be judged in order to be eligible for premiums.**
10. **Any exhibitor removing any of their animals from the barn before the release time will forfeit all their premium money.**
11. The posting and distribution of advertising matter is strictly prohibited other than in or from space occupied by exhibitor.
12. The Management assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to stock or exhibits from any cause.
13. The Management will take every precaution to protect the safety of stock or articles entered or shown after their arrival and placement; but under no circumstances will it be responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, or occasioned by, or arising from any animal or article on exhibition, and the exhibitor shall indemnify the York County Agricultural Society for any and all damages.
14. The Society reserves the right to withhold awards where its rules and regulations are not complied with, where fraud or deception has been practiced, or where the exhibit does not merit an award.
15. Fair reserves the right to reject or disqualify any entry. In all cases, the decision of the management shall be final.
16. False representation, interference or misconduct by an exhibitor or his agent will be dealt with by the Director in Charge of the departments wherein the exhibit is entered. There will be no appeal from this decision.
17. Protests against awards must be in writing and indicate the reason there for and be filed with the Secretary not later than the day after the award is made. Protestants will be granted a hearing if deemed necessary, by the Management.
18. Payment of premiums will be made by check.
19. **Premium checks must be cashed within 30 days. Deadline for reporting any discrepancies in award checks is October September 30th, 2021.**



JUDGES

1. Exhibitors are not permitted to act as judges in a class in which he or she exhibits or is directly or indirectly interested.
2. Judges must not award prizes to an unworthy exhibit. In the absence of competition, or where only one exhibit is entered, 1st, 2nd, 3rd or no premiums will be awarded according to the merit of the exhibit.
3. Judges will make special mention of meritorious exhibits for which no premium is offered.
4. Interference with judges will not be permitted. Interfering exhibitors will be barred from competition.
5. All award books or sheets must be properly signed by the judges and returned to the head of the department immediately after the completion of awards.
6. In paying premiums, no evidence of awards will be recognized except the entry book and sheets, signed by superintendents and judges. Ribbons, cards, and labels that may be attached to the exhibits will not be recognized.
7. The decision of the judges will be final in all cases except where error, fraud, misrepresentation or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the decision of the Management will be final.

PENNSYLVANIA FAIRS ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Section 3: Pennsylvania Cattle:

Requirements:


1. Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by PDA. Official identification includes:
 - A USDA- issued National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES) ear tag having a US shield ; or
 - A 15 digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840" and having a US shield ; or
 - Other identification approved by the PDA (brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).

Recommendations:

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1, 2021.
2. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
3. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian for animals 3 months of age and older (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw time.)
4. Rodeo: It is recommended that rodeo cattle of all ages be negative of an official tuberculin test within 60 days prior to the start of the fair unless they are members of and originate from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd. The cattle can be accompanied by the negative test report or the tuberculosis test results can be recorded by the veterinarian on a CVI.

Section 4: Out of State Cattle:

Requirements:

1. Federal regulations (USDA) require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.
2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS): This applies to cattle entering Pennsylvania from states that experienced a Vesicular Stomatitis outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals have neither been exposed to VS nor were located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."
3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.
4. Federal regulation (USDA) requires individual official animal identification. Official ID will have a US shield  and includes:
 - A USDA-issued National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES) tag; or
 - A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) ear tag starting with "840"; or
 - Other official identification approved by USDA (brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable).
5. Tuberculosis testing requirements:
 - No test is required for animals originating from states or zones designated as accredited free by the USDA.
 - All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited advanced by the USDA must be test negative within 60 days prior to the date of importation. The negative test results and dates of tests must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negatives test report (a copy of the original report is acceptable).
 - All animals originating from states or zones designated modified accredited by the USDA must originate from herds in which all animals 12 months of age and older are test negative within the 12 months prior to the date of importation and the individual animals (all ages) to be imported are also test negative within the 60 days prior to the date of importation and at least 60 days after the negative whole herd test was completed. The negative test results and date of test must be included on the CVI or the animal must be accompanied by a negative test report (a copy of the original test report is acceptable).

- **Special Tuberculosis Test requirement for Rodeo Cattle**

All rodeo cattle and bison from out of state must be negative on an official tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to entering Pennsylvania unless they originate from and are members of an Accredited Tuberculosis-free herd within an accredited Tuberculosis-free state or zone. This requirement for rodeo cattle from out of stat is in additional to all other requirements listed above for out of state cattle.

Recommendations:

1. A current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older (observe appropriate slaughter withdraw time).

IAFE (INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS) CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial and national levels. All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada. The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. Owners must be members in good standing of the American Highland Cattle Association or Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
2. All animals must be owned by the owner and breeding stock registered with the American Highland Cattle Association or Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
3. All shows will conform with IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics and show rules (see www.highlandcattleusa.org).
4. Registration papers must be presented to show officials or AHCA representatives upon request.
5. Tattoos must be legible and correspond to registration papers.
6. Use of hormones or steroids in animals exhibited is prohibited.
7. Purebred breeding cattle may not be dehorned.
8. A calf in the cow/calf class must be the cow's natural calf, still nursing and a maximum of 250 days old. Both the cow and calf must be registered purebred Highland cattle.
9. All bulls 12 months or older must be shown with a nose ring or nose lead. Note: We recommend that bulls be experienced with nose ring or nose lead prior to showing the animal.
10. All ROE shows attended will be counted in the cow/calf division. In the case of a tie for the cow/calf division, the cow/calf that has defeated the most animals will be the winner.
11. **Registered and unregistered** market animals (both pure and crossbred) and **registered** Sovereign heifers, will be included for the number of animals in a point show.
12. Only **registered** pure and crossbred market animals and **registered** Sovereign heifers will count toward the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor awards at all ROE shows.
13. Animals in group classes Get-of-Sire, Produce-of-Dam and Breeders Herd must be registered purebred Highland cattle.
14. Jackpot classes will be left to the discretion of each individual show to structure as they see fit (purebred/Sovereign/crossbred).

15. Show organizers need to use the Herdbook Search on AHCA's website to verify all animal names/numbers are correct in show catalogs before printing.
16. Also, all owners should be verified as current AHCA members and cattle entered on their entry forms are in their ownership.
17. A junior's age is determined as their age on January 1st and can show in junior classes through age 21.
18. Special consideration will be extended at all shows for persons with developmental disabilities to show in the junior show through age 26.

Standardized Rule Book is the governing document to be used when producing the International Championship Show, the International Youth Show and any regional shows where ITLA Qualifying Points are to be awarded. Deviations from the rules set forth in The Rule book may result in the show being classified as a Non-Qualifying Show (with no qualifying points or High Point Legacy points recorded) unless the show chairman receives specific permission from the ITLA Board Of Directors prior to the show.

Periodically, the rules and regulations contained in The Rule Book are reviewed and revised by the ITLA Show Rules Committee. Changes are presented to the ITLA Board of Directors for approval before inclusion. Every attempt will be made to inform members of any rule changes through updates in the ITLA Drover or posted on the official ITLA website.
